A reading nation is a leading nation. Use every opportunity to let your children read.
Reading is relaxing, but also important for the development and expansion of their language skills, concentration, critical thinking skills, to 'exercise' their brains and to discover new information and worlds.

Start reading books with your children when they are very small. The 'roots' of language are developed in your baby's brain long before your baby is able to talk. And, do not stop.

Tell your stories: Use this time where we spend more time than usual with our child to share stories about your childhood and family history. Tell a different story every evening. This is a fun way to celebrate your family's heritage and bond as a family.
